



In the month of June, we started the 'Resource Room' named as 'Happy Room'. We have circulated the checklist and asked the Class Teacher to identify the non-performing students.

The Class Teacher identified a student called S.A.Jayashree III Std that She is not obeying the teacher's orders, not able to read and write the classwork and distracting other students during the class period.

After obtaining the checklist, we went for class observation and found that the student is not co-operating with the class teacher. Then we have asked the class teacher to send her to the resource room.

Initially we have told the student to write the alphabets, but she is not able to write. Then we asked her to tell the alphabets and she has done correctly in oral. But she is not able to identify few alphabet correctly. She was adament that she will not read and write.

We have started <u>Wonder exercise</u>, <u>Brain gym</u>, <u>Super brain yoga</u>, <u>Lazy eight</u> slowly.

She turned to listen our teaching. We taught vowel and consonant sounds, sight words and she started to read and write the cvc words. Then she can able to read the small words using alphabet sounds.

After giving all these teaching methodologies, her class teacher has given the feedback that S.A.Jayashree is performing well in the class room and copying the classwork written on the board.

During the Quarterly Exam open day the parent met the class teacher and resource room teacher that their daughter is started to read and write on her own in the home without the parents guidance. They are happy that S.A.Jayashree is now interested on studies after attending the Resource room teaching.

In the end, Parent is very happy the resource room teachers are taking care of their daughter. Though the parents are excited we have asked them to support for their end.

In general, we have implemented the Brain gym, Wonder Exercise and Super brain yoga in the primary school assembly.

With the help of this activities children are getting boosted and they are concentrating more on the studies.



Our journey with MDA started on a personal note. My nephew was having learning difficulties and was unable to cope in mainstream schooling. Through trying to identify his issue as a family, we met the staff of MDA.

Through meeting them, our family was very much in awe of MDA and all of the wonderful work that they do. After many a conversation with Mr. Chandrasekhar, we were very moved by his vision and mission. We felt that it was fate that the St. Andrews family met the MDA family, and we were inspired to venture into the SLD field in an attempt to advocate for my nephew and to help other children in need.

As there were no specific services in Hyderabad dedicated to this cause, we wanted to establish a pullout program similar to MDAs school - Ananya. In 2018, in collaboration with MDA, we proudly opened 'Akira by St. Andrews', our pull out-program, which was built as a division of our mainstream school - St. Andrews School.

2023-2024 is now our 6th academic year. Over the years, we have had multiple staff attend the Intensive Teacher-Training Course in Chennai and come back to Hyderabad geared up and ready to work with our students.

Multiple MDA staff members have taken numerous trips to our school over the years for teacher training and monitoring in academics, Occupational Therapy and Multiple Intelligences.

The support we have received from MDA has helped us tremendously. Their guidance has had a huge impact on the growth of our staff. They have given our team the skills and confidence to handle students with different types of difficulties with greater confidence and ease each year.

Each time they visit, all students are reviewed and discussed by the Akira and MDA team together, which helps us make the best plan and decisions for each student going forward.

Ms. Yasho and Ms. Swetha have helped us dive into the world of MI and understand its vast benefits to students and teachers both. It is the highlight of the students' week and the activity they look forward to most. Their patient and willing nature makes them very approachable and easy to talk to. Our staff always feels moved after attending meetings or sessions with Ms. Yasho – she has that effect on people! Mr. Rasu has helped us set up our OT room and develop our therapy to make it what it is today. Over the years, he has worked with our different therapists to equip them with the knowledge and skills they need to best help our students.

We have been lucky enough to have Ms. Lata Vasanth & Ms. Lakshmi Hariharan as our guides and mentors over all of these years. Ms. Lata & Ms. Lakshmi have helped us right from understanding how to set up our center, to procurement, staffing, the admission process, identifying children that are within our scope of practice to remediate and help, how to educate and prepare parents in helping their children not only academically but holistically, and most importantly – in how we teach and handle our students. Over the years, they have guided us on how to improve our teaching and ourselves so that we can see the best results in our students.

It makes me very happy to share the below feedback given by a grandparent of an Akira student -

"When my nine year old granddaughter was having learning difficulties, I asked my friend in Chennai, who founded the Madras Dyslexia Association (MDA) for guidance. He told me about Akira, affiliated to St Andrews School in Marredpally. MDA helped in establishing Akira, and continues to help it run its programs.

The Resource Room helps students with learning difficulties to reach on par with the students in the main stream. The resource room provides support, tailored to the specific needs of the children. This targeted assistance significantly improve their learning outcomes.

The resource Room at Sankara acts like a bridge between remediation and the curriculum taught. The use of multisensory teaching methods have more of engaging learning experience. Regular progress monitoring in the resource room allows us to track the effectiveness of interventions and make necessary adjustments. Some parents feel comfortable and accept such remediation as it offers a one on one teaching approach. Parents also gain awareness of effective strategies and resources to support their child's learning at home. Many of the students attending Resource Room show a gradual improvement in comprehension skills and numeracy. A few students who have been attending Resource Room for the past 2-3 years have also been weaned off and absorbed into the main stream.

Early identification, workshops and frequent visits by the faculty of Madras Dyslexic Association has made the Resource Room an integral part of our primary education.

By recognizing and addressing the needs of students in the resource room, the overall stigma associated with learning differences can be reduced. This contributes to a more inclusive and accepting culture of the school.

Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) are crafted based on assessment findings, outlining personalized goals and interventions. Continuous monitoring and feedback sessions ensure ongoing adjustments, creating a holistic and effective support system for each student's unique learning needs.

10 students were selected for the academic year 2022–2023 by Selvi P. Renuga Devi's Resource Room with an emphasis on social and academic growth. Notable achievements include improved classroom participation, positive peer relationships, and enhanced note-taking skills. These advancements led to the successful reintegration of several students into classrooms, highlighting the effectiveness of personalized interventions. Selvi. P. Renuga Devi's guidance played a pivotal role in nurturing academic and social growth, reinforcing the commitment to excellence within our educational community. During the academic year 2023-2024, the Resource Room program were selected with 12 students, initially grappling with challenges in spelling, reading, and comprehension. Strategic interventions, complemented by wonder exercises, yielded substantial improvements. Notably, students not only mastered these strategies within the Resource Room but seamlessly applied them in mainstream classrooms, showcasing the efficacy of personalized academic support. Despite initial struggles in reading two-letter words, strategic remediation efforts focusing on phonetic sounds and rules have resulted in commendable progress. The commitment to fostering academic growth is evident in the positive strides made by each student under Smt. Shanthi's guidance.
